




eHealth Strategy 'To Be Architecture'

- "Utilise best of breed standards and flavour to Irish specifics (satisfying domestic need in doing so)"
- "Better time management of resources"
- "Greater confidence in eHealth solutions"
- "Optimises Patient safety from the outset"
- "Access to the Digital Market"
- "Greater protection for public funding with a more competitive tendering process, levels the playing field smaller vendors can participate"
- "During testing process and the specific tests are passed, theoretically vendor can deliver project".
